

^{*} Hebrews months followed the Lunar calendar, and therefore alternated between 29 and 30 days. Their year had 354 days. Due to the variation in lunar orbit, an extra 29-day month was necessary 7 times in 19 years. Veadar (or Adar II) was the month added when necessary (approx. every 3 years)
